What is bullying?

Our definition of Bullying is:

'Any verbal, physical or emotional act with malicious intent on the part of one or more persons which is persistent. In some instances it may be an isolated act'

The bullying may be:

- Physical—pushing, hitting, kicking, pinching
- Verbal - name calling, teasing
- Emotional - tormenting, ridicule, intimidation
- Racist - racial taunts
- Sexual - unwanted physical contact or abusive comments
- Group Shunning
- Cyber bullying

Bullying is a persistent behaviour which intimidates individuals or groups through verbal, physical or emotional aggression.

The children understand that this behaviour is not tolerated.
